Welcome to discover the Southern Cost of Crimea. The picturesque road from Sudak to Yalta runs along the seacoast from east to west. Maritime landscapes give way to mountain scenes, and the traveler has a great opportunity to admire the rocks of the famous Major Crimean Mountain Range: Karabi, Demerdzhi, Chatyrdag, Babugan, Kastel, Ayu-Dag, Ay-Petri. The bus will pass by resorts, monuments of history and architecture: Morskoye, Genoese fortress, Rybachye, a unique St. Nicholas church-lighthouse in Malorechenskoye, Solnechnogorskoye, Alushta, Partenit, Gurzuf, Artek.

A detailed excursion is in store for you in the State Nikitsky Botanical Garden. The Garden, a fabulous embodiment of human genius and nature, was founded by Academician H.H. Steven in 1812. Designed in a landscape style with terraces lowering gradually to the sea, this Garden is quite lawfully positioned as one of the most beautiful parks of Europe. Nowadays, the collection of the Garden totals 18,000 plant species, cultivars and hybrids. You will be invited to stroll along the alleys of the Upper and Lower parks, admire plants imported from all continents the world over: pyramidal cypresses; Lebanon, deodar and blue Atlas cedars; palms and banana trees; pines and firs; holly and cork oaks; wisteria and fig trees; sequoia and magnolia; mammoth tree, Grecian laurel, gingko, yew, Montezuma pine, medlar and persimmon, strawberry-tree. Remarkable are collections of canna, chrysanthemums, tulips, clematises, cacti, almonds, granatum. The collection of roses alone has more than 2,000 species!

The next stop will be in Alupka. Here, you will visit Vorontsov Palace and Park – a real masterpiece of architecture and landscape gardening of the 19th century. The former summer residence of Count M.S. Vorontsov is in full harmony with the landscape. The designer of the Palace, the well-known English architect Edward Blore (1789–1879), combined in this building the solidity of English gothic castles and the lightness of the constructions of the Muslim East. Thanks to the fortunately found architectural forms the palace acquired this inimitable romantic style. The inner decoration of the rooms matches the architecture of the building. A gorgeous park surrounds the Palace.

On the way to Yalta the bus will stop for you to admire the symbol of the Southern Coast of Crimea – a miniature palace called «Lastochkino Gnezdo» (Swallow's Nest), located on the very edge of the cliff. Promenading along the embankment of Yalta will be a final chord in the fabulous symphony of beauty and harmony of the Southern Coast of Crimea.

Tour 2

Dzhur-Dzhur (Noisy) Waterfall–Mramornaya (Marble) Cave

Tour: Rybachye–Generalskoye–Alushta–Chatyrdag–Simferopol

Departure time: 7.30

Duration: 13 hours

Notes: comfortable shoes, cap, drinking water

This tour is for those who love nature. Leave urban scenes behind and move closer to nature to admire the unique perfection of natural monuments. In this tour, you will see the highlands, woodlands and steppes of Crimea, climb the Chatyrdag plateau (920 m above sea level) and Angarsky mountain pass (752 m), and, while climbing, you will admire the breath-taking maritime landscape.

The Marble Cave is a cove unique in dimensions and a diversity of mineral sediments. It is located at the lower Chatyrdag plateau and is convenient for visiting. The Cave is a system of remarkably large galleries reaching depth of 10-80 m. You will visit the Fairy-tale Gallery and the Tiger's Passage. Both galleries are intricately decorated with stalactites, stalagmites and dripstones. Please do not forget to take a warm coat – the temperature in the cave is +9°C. (A propos, coats can be rented at the entrance to the cave). Having seen this place, you will understand why the Marble Cave is one of the five most beautiful caves of the world.

From the village of Generalskoye you will take a forest pass (a high-sided truck will be also provided for extra pay) to go up to Dzhur-Dzhur – the most powerful and unbelievably picturesque Crimean waterfall. The Ulu-Uzen River flows along a gloomy ravine and, coming through a three-stage threshold, falls from the 100-m height. From a limestone shelf 15 m high it falls as a 5-m wide stream into a deep and, from there, runs to the riverbed. The grandeur and severity of the surrounding mountains, the waters of Dzhur-Dzhur in the sunlight against the greenish mossy mountains leave travelers spellbound...

Walk approximately 1 km up the riverbed along the Khapkhal ravine – and you will come to a series of most attractive thresholds that fall into the so-called "baths of youth". The bravest may have a bathe (the temperature is +10+12°C).

Tour 3

Stary Krym (Old Crimea)

(Memorial museum and tomb of the romantic writer Alexander Grin, Surb-Khach (Saint Cross) medieval Armenian cloister, St. Panteleimon spring, Khan Uzbek Mosque and the 14th century madrasa)

Tour: Sudak – Stary Krym

Notes: comfortable shoes

Welcome to Stary Krym – the ancient capital of Crimea, a town of medieval architecture, mysterious caves and sparkling springs; a town filled with clear air of the steppes, sea and mountain forest. This tour will be both a pilgrimage and a travel through different historical periods.

The first sight of the tour will be an Armenian monastery Surb-Khach (Saint Cross), which will celebrate this year its 650th anniversary! Surb-Khach is one of 200 most valuable memorial places of Ukraine protected by the government. This medieval cloister is located in a picturesque ravine, and pilgrims reach it by walking along a 2-km forest pass. Today, on the premises of the cloister, you can see the restored buildings and two healing springs. Surb-Khach is still the center of spiritual attraction for Armenians.

Among other sights and sanctities of Stary Krym are St. Panteleimon healing spring and chapel (19th c.), a mosque and madrasa built in 1314 during the reign of the Golden Horde Khan Uzbek.

The cultural heritage of Stary Krym is inseparable of the romantic writer Alexander Grin. Here, he spent the last 6 months of his distressful life. The house museum surprises by its utter modesty and plainness and, thus, shows how powerful and rich was the inner world of the writer who managed to invent “a sparkling world of kindness out of a combination of sheer imagination and truth”.

When this trip is over, the inner light will keep glowing in your sole, and this light will lead you out of the surrounding “moral desert”, it will leave your heart tranquil, and you will feel blessed as after spiritual self-perfection.

Tour 4

ARKHADERESSE – sampling elite Crimean wines

Tour: Sudak – Solnechnaya Dolina (Sunny Valley) – Arkhaderesse

Departure time: 9.30; 15.00

Duration: 3 hours

Crimean wines are a real treasure of the peninsula. Everyone arriving to Sudak must taste the sweet and astringent flavor of the sunny wines being produced exclusively in this region.

Not a long way from Sudak, close to the foot of the Meganom Cape, there is a vast land with low hills and valleys. Every summer it is turned into a sun-beaten semi-desert, swept by scorching sea winds. An uninhabited place close to the village of Solnechnaya Dolina (Sunny Valley) was named Arkhaderesse, which in Turkic means «the back of the ravines». On these lands, which belonged at the end of the 19th century to the son of the last Chancellor of Russia A.M. Gorchakov, Prince Lev Golitsyn built wine cellars and started to grow wine grapes. It was in 1888. He found that the Crimean soil contained chert, which signified that these soils could be used for making sparkling wines. With all his enthusiasm he plunged into growing wine grapes, building a winery, and making specialty Arkhaderesse wines.

Today, 120 years later, the Open Joint-Stock Company «Solnechnaya Dolina» grows on these vineyards rare native varieties of wine grapes – Ekim-Kara, Dzhevat-Kara, Kok-Pandas and Sary-Pandas, which are used for making elite wines. The cellars of Arkhaderesse, which you will visit in the course of the tour, are in good order and condition, and there, as before, people produce miracles of wine industry.

The high quality of Solnechnaya Dolina wines has been confirmed by over 110 golden and silver medals of international contests. Unique Solnechnaya Dolina wines have been deservedly put on the list of objects of national pride and endowment of Ukraine.

When sampling the wines, you will be instructed in the appreciation of the difference between the velvety flavor of Black Doctor, pleasant roughness of Black Colonel, amber sweetness of Solnechnaya Dolina and freshness of Meganom. You will undoubtedly leave the place in high spirit!

The buses will leave from the Main Gate at the time announced.

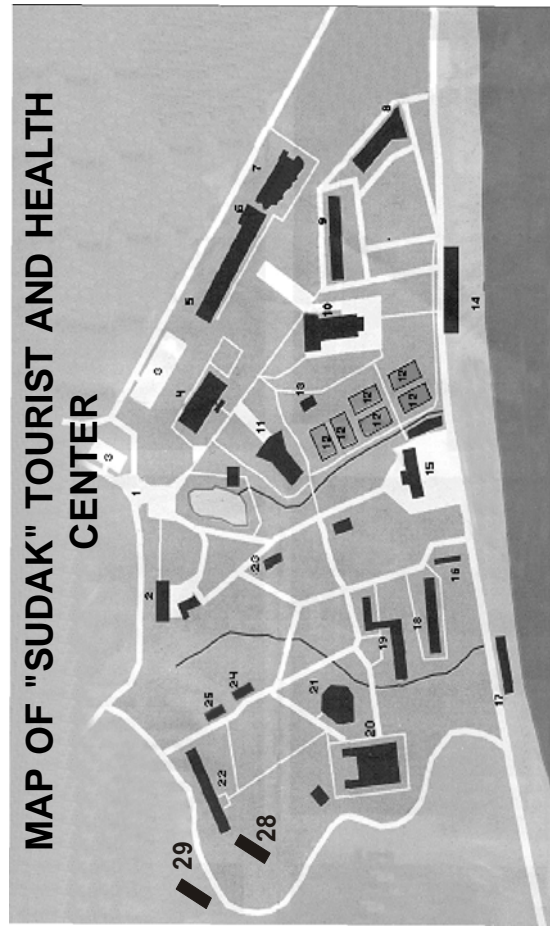

The Geography of the Fifteenth Jubilee International Conference “Crimea 2008”

The Crimean Peninsula, located almost midway between the Equator and the North Pole, resembles a green grape leaf thrown over the sea. Relatively low Crimean Mountains run along the sea for almost 180 km, protecting the coast from cold northern winds and maintaining the subtropical climate on the peninsula.

Crimea is proud famous for its wonderful resorts, delicious wines and historic memorials. The fates of many tribes and peoples intersected on this land.

The places of interest in Crimea is the Crimea itself.

SUDAK

Sudak – the main Conference venue – welcomes the Conference for the 12-th time already.

Sudak was known as Sugdeya to the ancient Greeks, Soldaya to the Genoese, and Surozh to the ancient Russians. The town grew up on the coast of conveniently located harbor, which was the focal point of the land routes from Eastern Europe and Asia. From the very start it was an important junction for the Black Sea navigation. Sudak is located in the southern part of Sudak Valley on the coast of the Sudak Bay of the Black Sea.

Sudak Valley is very picturesque and rich.

It is the most extensive valley in southeastern Crimea. Suuk-Su (Cold Water) river runs through the valley. The valley is surrounded by high mountains with bizarre peaks. They protect the valley from cold winds, while cool afternoon breezes soften the heat of the sun. The abundance of the verdure makes the valley most picturesque.

The traces of human beings in the Sudak region go back to the Paleolithic age (80-30 thousand years BC). The Taures lived here in the first millennium



BC and the first centuries AD. Historical sources consider 212 AD as the year of the town foundation. The foundation of the town and its name Sugdeya are linked to Alans (ancestors of modern Ossetians).

In VIII and IX centuries Sugdeya was the administrative center of the Khazars, the then owners of the Crimea. The Khazars were succeeded by Pechenegs, and those by the Polovtses. Over the XI-XIII centuries Sugdeya flourished as an international center. Merchants from Russia, Western Europe, Northern Africa, China, and India had their business here. Later on the Venetians arrived and built their trading stations and fortresses here. Sudak- Soldaya was the biggest fortress. A wealthy town attracted conquerors. It suffered numerous assaults by Turks and Mongols, which resulted to the town's decay. It lost its significance. The Genoese captured the town in XIV century. They restored its defense system, but despite that the Turks conquered the town. Under the Turks domination the town lost its significance as well.

In XIX century Crimea was allotted into the Russian Empire. A new stage of Sudak development started at that time. Vineyards and fruit gardens were planted and new buildings were constructed. From late XIX century on Sudak is known as a Black Sea resort.

The Civil War and World War II didn't skirt Sudak. Each time the town was rebuilt and kept living...

The main street in Sudak, the Lenin Street, goes past the "Sudak" Tourist and Health Center. Right after the Center the Sugar Head rock overlooks the road. Right behind the rock the impressive ruins of the Sudak fortress can be seen. The Fortress is one of the major and impressive historical sites of the Crimean Peninsula. Its two-tier defense constructions still look inaccessible. The constructions of various times (walls, towers, temples, and casemates) keep the memory on various peoples, Greeks, Armenians, Khazars, Turks, Italians, and Russians...

The oldest memorial of the Russian period in Sudak is the church of the early XIX century. The first local hospital building and Tatar neighborhood of the old town have survived all cataclysms as well. Low houses with tile roofs go up the hill.

Modern Sudak is a center of viticulture and winemaking. Seven big vineyards produce about 20,000 tons of high-grade grapes annually for the original dessert wines. The ether-oil species, such as rose, lavender and sage are planted in the Valley. The product of Production local ether-oil factory is partially exported to foreign companies.

BELOGORSK

For the first time Belogorsk was mentioned in written in XIII century.

The initial name (up to 1944) of the town is Karasubazar (Market on the Black River).

Due to favorable geographic location Karasubazar as well as Solkhat (Stary Krym) was an important trading center in medieval times. Fragments of big medieval caravanserai Tash-Khana (Stone Palace) survived in the central part of the town in the market neighborhood.



Karasubazar was the main town of a single borough under kalga-sultan ruling within Crimean Khanate. During 1634-1675 the town was conquered by Zaporizhzhya Cossacks four times. In 1736 the khan moved his residency to Karasubazar after Minikh had ruined Bakhchisarai. But a year later the town was taken by Russian troops (headed by General Douglas) and busted. Finally Russians conquered Karasubazar in 1777. After Crimea allot to Russia the Prince G. A. Potemkin called Tatar beys to the White Rock to make them swear to the Empress.

The White Rock (Ak-Kaya) is the major place of interest in the district. It is located in 5km from the town and looks like an unscalable wall. It is 100m high above the land and 325m high above the sea level. Ak-Kaya is a concentration of Paleolithic memorials. For many decades water, wind and sun created on the rock a bizarre brows and caves looking like fortress towers and loop-holes. About 20 camps and settlements of primitives were disclosed at the bottom of the rock and researched.

SIMFEROPOL

Simpheropolis means “a city of benefit and a gatherer” and its coat of arms carries a hive with honeybees and an inscription “Poleznoye” (literally, “Beneficial”). Simferopol is located in the center of the Crimean Peninsula and accumulates everything the peninsula is famous for. The city is administrative, economic, and cultural center of the Crimean Autonomous Republic.

The city’s locality has a long and rich history. From the 3d century BC to the 4th century AD, Neapolis, the capital of the Scythian state, was located on the plateau south from the today’s city center. This was a vital place in the times of the Crimean khanate and, for some time, the residence of Kalgi Sultan, the second person in the khanate.

Today, Simferopol cannot boast of architectural sites but some buildings are worthy of attention: Kebir-Jami Mosque, the city’s oldest building of 1508; Vorontsov’s House in the park Salgirka; the former male regional gymnasium; the former hospice; Franko Republican Universal Scientific Library which was built in 1826 for the Gentility Assembly and gave its premises during the Crimean War to the hospital where the famous surgeon N. I. Pirogov worked; the nearby Gorky Russian Drama Theater which was erected in 1911 after the plans of an eminent architect A. N. Beketov.



STARY KRYM

Surrounded by numerous gardens, the town of Stary Krym is located at the bottom of the Agarmysh Mountain.

The town's previous name is Solkhat. In ancient times it was a busy center of trade with Minor Asia, Middle Africa and the East. The caravan route from Perekop to Kaffa ran through the town.

In the first half of XIV century Solkhat was conquered by Batyi troops. The



town got its new name Krym coming from the word Kyrym (moat). It became an administrative center of the Crimean province of the Golden Horde, and later – a religious center of the Peninsula. The remains of fortress walls and wide moat, which served as fortifications, survived in the eastern outskirts of the town. Ruins of the Big Madrasah and Uzbek Mosque, constructed in 1314 under the Golden Horde ruler Uzbek-khan survived as well.

There were several churches and four Armenian monasteries in Solkhat and vicinity. The famous Surb-Hatch (The Holy Cross) Armenian Monastery, constructed in 1338, survived in pretty good condition.

Beautiful buildings, palaces, mosques, bathhouses and fountains decorated the city during the times of its prosperity. As one Arabian tripper of XIV century wrote, "...you need at least a day to ride around".

Upon the Crimean Khanate formation with the capital in Bakhchisarai the town entitled Eski-Krym (Stary Krym, Old Crimea) lost its significance.

The present Stary Krym is a quiet and modest town. Several enterprises operate here as well as the sanatorium of the same title. The outstanding surgeon and scholar N. M. Amosov was the Head of the sanatorium for a long time.

Writer A. Grin, whose health was broken by incurable disease, spent last two years of his life in Stary Krym. He moved to this "town of flowers, quietness and remains" from Feodosiya in 1930. "Up to the last days of mine I would like to walk around bright countries of my fantasy", - Grin wrote. The writer died July 8, 1932 and was buried on the town cemetery. A memorial museum was opened in his house.

FEODOSIA

Feodosia is one of the oldest towns in Europe. It is over 2,500 years old. Ellins settled here long Before Christ. They founded the town and called it Feodosia (God-given). Ancient Feodosia was famous for its harbor and seaport as well as rich fields.

Later the town was allotted into the Bosphorus State. In the IV century BC it was destroyed by the Huns. In medieval times the town was known as Kaffa. The Genoese ruled the town for two centuries and made it the administrative and trade center of their Crimean provinces. Fortifications defending from Tatar were built around the town.

Their remains survived up to date. In the XV century Kaffa was conquered by the Ottoman Turks and became the center the Turkish Sultan Crimean province and the main slave market.

During the Russian-Turkish War the town was taken by Russians. The initial name Feodosia was returned to the town. During the World War II the front line passed through Feodosia four times.

The town has lost its ancient image. It was destroyed too much times in its ancient and modern history, but medieval street planning survived in one of the neighborhoods.

Many places in Feodosia are associated with famous individuals. The great artist I. Aivazovsky was born and spent the great deal of his life here. Poet M. Voloshin and writer A. Grin lived in Feodosia as well.
