Tour № 1

KERCH

(free for the early registered participants)

Departure time: **7.00**

Duration: **14 hours**

Tour type: **Coach and walking tour** (walking part of the tour: 3 km)

The main tour program includes visits to the mountain of Mitridat, John the Forerunner Church, Adjimushkay Quarries, the Csar's Kurgan and Kerch Fortress.

For history lovers, tour to Kerch is the most attractive one. You will find yourself on the Kerch Peninsula, on the strait shore between the waters of two seas – the Black and the Azov Sea. Chronicles confirms the city's age of 26 centuries. During this long period, it was not once that the city flourished and declined, was destroyed and was restored. Since VI BC it was a city-state named Panticapaeum, then Byzantine Bospor, Slavic Korchev, Khazarian Karkh, Italian Cerco (Cherkio), Turkish Karsha. Therefore Kerch attracts tourists with its unique ancient monuments, medieval architecture, its heroic past. Its every stone has become history. The tour program is comprehensive and hard-driving, and covers almost all the outstanding events in the history of this city "of two seas". You will look at the breath-taking panorama of the city from the top of Mitridat Mountain (98 m above sea level. Here you will see the Glory obelisk in the memory of the defenders and liberators of the Hero-city, and the ruins of ancient Panticapaeum (VI BC), the capital of the Bospor Kingdom for almost 9 centuries. You will go down the Great Mitridat Staircase (420 stairs) decorated with gryphons.

In the central square you will approach the refurbished Church of John the Forerunner built in 10th century. It is one of the oldest functional Christian churches in the Crimea.

Then you will make your way towards Adjimushkay Quarries: the tour of underground labyrinth will take 45 minutes. During the tour, you will learn how the stone was quarried before the October Revolution, and about the tragic 170 days in 1942 during the Great Patriotic War, when 13,000 Soviet soldiers with several thousands of civic population had to hide themselves underground and to fight heroically against the fascists.

Not far away from Adjimushkay there is the Csar's Kurgan – a monument of ancient burial architecture (VI BC). This masterpiece has no parallels to any of known monuments of that kind, and it has survived almost in its original state. Researchers suggest that one of the influential Bospor csars was buried here.

You will have a chance to enter the burial chamber and to see the true value of ancient stonecutters.

You will walk about “Kerch” Fortress (Fort of Totleben) founded by Csar Alexander II. It is situated on the shore of the Strait of Kerch near Ak-Burun Cape. The fortress was built in 1857–1877. In nineteenth century it was the most significant naval citadel along with Kronstadt in the Baltic Sea. In the early 20-th century it was a political prison. Since 1950ies till nowadays military units and warehouses were located here. The big lot of 400 hectares (988 acres) was shut down behind barbed wire, and even Kerchians had a vague idea about the restricted area. The buildings solidity and good quality amaze experts, and many things remain in their original state – including inscriptions on plaster made one century and a half ago. Three-kilometer (.86 miles) long and 5-meter (16.4 f) deep trench stays undamaged, as well as caponiers – fighting shelters, powder magazines, 600-meter tunnel (1968.6 f). In one of the tunnels, the most clear and amiable Echo in the Crimea lives.

CRIMEAN RESERVE (fee-based tour)

Many people know about the Crimean Natural Reserve – the oldest and one of the major reserves in Ukraine. However, the tour to the Reserve is a completely new tour. The Romanov’s Route runs via the Crimean Natural Reserve wide. There is the strict pass control in the Reserve but that is done essentially for the purpose to secure the wilderness of the Crimean Mountains. Those lucky, who travelled via this Route, know for sure that it is the most beautiful route on the Peninsula.

The Romanov’s Route starts from the Saints Cosmas and Damian Monastery, goes up to Chuchel swell as a streamlined serpentine; rounds the Roman-Kosh peak, the highest peak in Crimea; creeps Nikita yaila coming close to the Arbor of Winds soaring beyond Gurzuf valley; goes down to “Kransniy Kamen” (“Red Stone”) cordon where an extremely beautiful panorama of Yalta amphitheater is

visible, and finally goes down via Massandra flank. During the tour to the Resort you will visit all climatic zones of Crimean mountains.

The main advantage you will get is to look at virgin nature, feast your eyes with amazing panoramas from scenic viewpoints on the Romanov's Route that is 60 km (37.29 miles) long in the the highest protected hills of the Crimea.

The tour begins in the town of Alushta, from the building of the Crimean Natural Reserve Administration and ends at the cordon of "Pear Field", 6 kilometers (3.73 miles) away from Massandra. The duration of the tour is 5 hours and the route runs mainly along the famous Romanov highway. The way is rather difficult – serpentine all over the road, though many stops are scheduled.

The first stop is at the Californian Trout Farm where at its research laboratories in the open air you will get a chance to learn how fish is farmed. The farm in the upper Alma River was found in 1958.

Then you'll visit Cosmas and Damian Monastery found in 1856 in the upper Alma River near the Spring of Saints Cosmas and Damian. It was one of the main Christian holy places in the Crimea. In 1880ies the Csar Hunting Lodge was built not far away from the Monastery, and it was not once that the csars Alexander III, Nikolai II with Empress Alexandra Feodorovna stayed there.

You will be told the legend of brothers and healers Cosmas and Damian who lived in the second half of III century AD, on the history of the Monastery; you will visit the Monastery's healing spring, the Chapel and the Church.

Today it's a functional frater with metochion in the town of Partenit. In the Winter Church you will see the Monastery's main holy things – the old icon of St. Cosmas and Damian with parts of their relics, the icon of Jerusalem Lady.

From the Monastery, higher in the mountains the Romanov Highways begins; it's one of the most beautiful roads on the Crimean Peninsula. The road was laid at personal will of Csar Nikolai II in 1913. After passing the gap named "the Csar Gate" you will ascend to Chuchel Pass, 1,150 m (3773 feet) above sea level. From the scenic viewpoint you will look at the panorama of the northern slopes of the Main Ridge of the Crimean Mountains, mountains of Basman, Minor Chuchel, Kemal-Egerek and the highest mountain in the Crimea Roman-Kosh (1,545 m, or 5,069 feet above sea level). The next stop will be at the head of the Kacha River, where one of the Peninsula's main streams is born.

The tour culmination is the view that opens from the Wind Pavilion (1426 m, or 4679 feet above sea level), where you will see a bird's-eye view of Gurzuf Valley, and the mountain Ayu-Dag will seem a bear cub to you. A small monument on the Nikitsky Pass marks the highest point of 1,448 meters, or 4751 feet above sea level. From the scenic viepoint of "Red Stone" Cordon you will see the amphitheatre of Yalta City, and at last – the panorama of Uch-Kosh Gorge. From your guides you will learn in detail not only the history of the oldest reserve in Ukraine but also get familiar with flora and fauna of the Crimean mountains, the history of St. Cosmas and Damian Monastery and Saint Springs of Savlukh-Su. Probably, you will be lucky to see wild animals: Crimean red deer, European roedeer, etc. The tour ends in the city of Yalta, when you will have 1 hour free to walk along the famous resort embankment . After that the bus departs to Sudak.

**EMINE-BAIR-KHOSAR
(fee-based tour)**

Crimea is said to be 'an open-air' museum. The Emine-Bair-Khosar cave is included into the list of top-five beautiful caves in the world. It is a real underground museum designed by the Nature, while it mixed the stones for millions of years. The Emine-Bair-Khosar cave is located on Chatyr-Dag. You will not have to walk there, the bus stops in 100 m before the entrance. The Emine-Bair-Khosar cave holds an exclusive position in the list of European natural phenomena. Speleologists entered the disclosed pit in 1927. The cave became known world-wide after Simferopol speleologists examined 1,500 underground halls and galleries covered by calcite crystals of various colors.

There are over 100 caves in Chatyr-Dag, but this one is considered the most beautiful. You will see wide underground halls, millions of stalactites and stalagmites, underwater lakes. You will also make yourself familiar with underground paleontological museum, where you will see the bones of pre-historic animals – a mammoth, woolly rhinoceros, bison, cave lion and bear. Duration of the tour to the cave is 1 hour and 20 minutes (Northern Gallery + Idols Hall + «Kechkemet» Hall). The route length in the cave does not exceed 700 m.

The cave is specifically equipped for visiting: all are cement-grouted, electricity is on everywhere.

1 hour is reserved for lunch.

The main program of the tour to Bakhchisaray includes the tour of Hansaray (Khan's Palace), medieval Assumption Monastery and town-fortress Chufut-Kale. Bakhchisaray is translated from Turkic as "the Garden-Palace". The town of Bakhchisaray is situated in the narrow pocket of the Churuk-Su River. In 15th – 18-th centuries it was the capital of the Crimean Khanate separated from the Golden Horde. Bakhchisaray as the capital of the Crimean Khanate today is called the tourist Mecca in the Crimea. Despite all the changes, old Bakhchisaray kept its medieval flavor. Its main attraction is the unique architectural monument of the 15th—18th century – Khan's Palace. The former residence of khans is now among the top three popular historical monuments in the Crimea. It is not only a stateroom, it's a medieval feudatory that included all the features essential for a khan's life. The ensemble includes show rooms and a khan's private quarters, buildings for servants and Harem, pavillions for relaxation and fountains, outbuildings and gate towers. The yard architectural value is emphasized by a rosary, green lace of the park and interior gardens. In 1764, by order of Qirim-Giray Khan, the "Fountain of Tears" was built on the grove of his beloved wife who had died an early death. This monument is berythmed by Alexander Pushkin. In one of the Palace buildings there is the Museum of Crimean Tatars Culture. The guided tour lasts for 2 hours.

Not far away from Bakhchisaray, amazing monuments of the Crimean Medieval Ages are situated, the so-called "cave towns". Chufut-Kale – one of the well-known cave towns in the Crimea, 3.5 kilometers (2.175 miles) to the south of Bakhchisaray Palace. The road runs along the southern slope of Maryam-Dere Gorge and comes to the pediment of the wide staircase leading to the cave Orthodox Assumption Monastery built approximately in the 8th century. The altar

of the main church of the monastery is cavate inside the mountain wall. There is the holy spring near the monastery.

The steep narrow staircase leads from the Monastery to the plateau where you will look at the picturesque panorama of mountains and the gorge with old Bakhchisaray town bosomed in trees and its famous museum palace, the fantastic cliffs resembling sphinxes, deep canyons and wide plateau. You will see everything during 2.5 km (1.5 mile) walk to the ancestral land and the greatest national sanctuary of Karaims – the cave town of Chufut-Kales built on the inaccessible mountain cliffs 200 meters (656 feet) above the neighbor valleys. It is one of the best preserved cave towns in the Crimea. You will see house basements, part of vallum, the gate. The tourists will see the mausoleum of Dzhanike-Khanym -Khan Tokhtamysh's daughter, the karaims' kenasses – preaching houses and households left by their last residents in 1920s. Today it is a dead town. Chufut-Kale cliffs and its once unapproachable walls keep their secrets.

The duration of the guided tour of Chufut-kale is 3 hours.

Tour № 5

THE ARPAT WATERFALL – CHOBAN-KULE TOWER (free for the early registered participants)

Departure time: **8.00**

Duration: **7 hours**

Tour type: **Coach tour**

The picturesque waterfall of Arpat is situated not far away from the ancient settlement of Zelenogorye (“green hills”) well-known since Medieval Ages (its old name was Arpat), amongst forests and mountains. The coach part of the tour runs along Sudak-Alushta highway and passes villages of Veseloye and Morskoye. Many splitting chases there were filmed (“Three plus Two” , “Night without Mercy”, etc.).

We will come to Zelenogorye via 8-km mountain road. Its old name – Arpat which possibly meant “downfall”, or maybe, from Tatar ‘arpa”, “barley”. The land was almost not fertile, and people grew barley on the terraces.

On the outskirts of the settlement there is a beautiful mountain lake of unusual color with underwater springs. If you are bored with seawaters you can swim in the lake—the water is clear and warm even in early summer.

Though the main local attraction is a narrow stow where in awe days local residents hid themselves – women and children, while the men defended the narrow pass through the mountain walls. The walking part of the tour (3 km (1.9 miles)) passes along the shore of the Pananyan-Uzen River ((in Greek, “Holy River”) via Panagia

(Holy Mother) Gorge. These toponyms are explained by the fact that the Greek monastery of Holy Mother was situated there.

The gorge itself is almost naked without forest, with only some bushes. In its narrowest place where the stone walls squeeze the river, a small canyon is formed. The narrow water stream runs and forms the cascade of small waterfalls and river bends. In some impassible places, tourists will find metallic staircases.

Moving along the path, you will suddenly see a turbulent river – it so strange for the hot summer days in the Crimea, – and a lot of cozy clean natural baths full of water, and a well-laid path. If it had not been so skilfully laid, a few of tourists would reach the last 10-meter waterfall. You are unlikely to win it without satirs and bridges. The legend said that this path was called “The Path of Amazons”. The Amazons were said to run here when they were choosing a husband who had to follow if they wanted to marry a girl.

One of the valley's ornaments is the Bath of Lover, and the Arpat Waterfall mouths into it. Many mountain stone bowls in the world are called “baths of love” but in this place waters washed almost a perfect heart off the stone, and every guide will suggest you her own legend. However, it is not so easy to pile into the Bath. Above it, there is a lake where you can swim.

The one more, biggest single waterfall awaits you onwards. It's about 10 meters (33 feet) high. The path runs about and up the cliffs over the waterfall.

The standard tour route ends up at this point. Groups go round the waterful and those who wish may swim but with care, the stones are very slippery.

Near Morskoye village you will find the medieval tower of Choban-Kule (“shephard's tower”). It is an architectural monument where feudal lords, the Guasko brothers from Genoa lived in the 15-th century. The Tower is surrounded with the ruins of old buildings and defensive walls. It is said that the tower belongs to the tower complex of the medieval Tasili fortress, also owned by di Guasko brothers known for their rudeness and fierceness and unwilling to bow to the Sudak community.

The tower is made of massive stones, most probably elevated from the sea. The walls are up to 2-3 meters thick. Today its height is about 9-10 meters. The entrance to the tower is on its south-west and is significantly ruined. The chimney and pools for water can be seen in the basement.

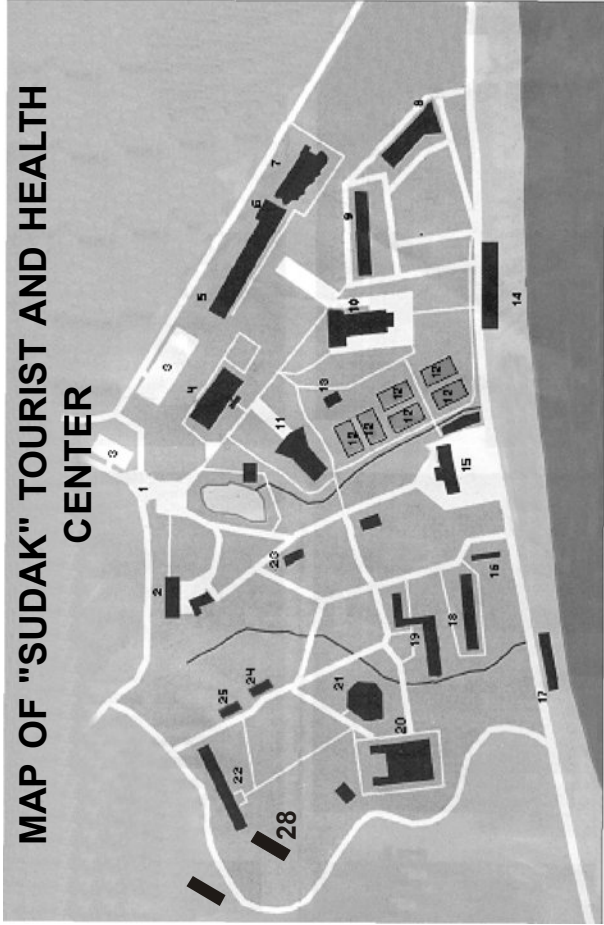
On the eastern side, you can still see the ruins of defensive walls, some sources say there was a church nearby, and some buildings which is evidenced by the massive ruins at the tower foundation. On the northern and eastern side archeological excavations are being made.

From the tower you will have a chance to look at the great panorama, don't forget your photo/video cameras. From Choban-Kule you will see Meganom, Chekan-Kaya, Ay-Foka – on your left, and the ridge of beautiful mountains crowned with Ayu-Dag – on your right.

The buses will leave from the main gate at the time announced. Boarding passes are required.

The Geography of the Seventeenth International Conference «Crimea 2010»

The Crimean Peninsula, located almost midway between the Equator and the North Pole, resembles a green grape leaf thrown over the sea. Relatively low Crimean Mountains run along the sea for almost 180 km, protecting the coast from cold northern winds and maintaining the subtropical climate on the peninsula.

Crimea is proud famous for its wonderful resorts, delicious wines and historic memorials. The fates of many tribes and peoples intersected on this land.

The places of interest in Crimea is the Crimea itself.

SUDAK

Sudak – the main Conference venue – welcomes the Conference for the 14-th time already.

Sudak was known as Sugdeya to the ancient Greeks, Soldaya to the Genoese, and Surozh to the ancient Russians. The town grew up on the coast of conveniently located harbor, which was the focal point of the land routes from Eastern Europe and Asia. From the very start it was an important junction for the Black Sea navigation.

Sudak is located in the southern part of Sudak Valley on the coast of the Sudak Bay of the Black Sea.

Sudak Valley is very picturesque and rich. It is the most extensive valley in southeastern Crimea. Suuk-Su (Cold Water) river runs through the valley. The valley is surrounded by high mountains with bizarre peaks. They protect the valley from cold winds, while cool afternoon breezes soften the heat of the sun. The abundance of the verdure makes the valley most picturesque.

The traces of human beings in the Sudak region go back to the Paleolithic age (80-30 thousand years BC). The Taures lived here in the first millennium BC and the first centuries AD. Historical sources consider 212 AD as the



year of the town foundation. The foundation of the town and its name Sugdeya are linked to Alans (ancestors of modern Ossetians).

In VIII and IX centuries Sugdeya was the administrative center of the Khazars, the then owners of the Crimea. The Khazars were succeeded by Pechenegs, and those by the Polovtses. Over the XI-XIII centuries Sugdeya flourished as an international center. Merchants from Russia, Western Europe, Northern Africa, China, and India had their business here. Later on the Venetians arrived and built their trading stations and fortresses here. Sudak-Soldaya was the biggest fortress. A wealthy town attracted conquerors. It suffered numerous assaults by Turks and Mongols, which resulted to the town's decay. It lost its significance. The Genoese captured the town in XIV century. They restored its defense system, but despite that the Turks conquered the town. Under the Turks domination the town lost its significance as well.

In XIX century Crimea was allotted into the Russian Empire. A new stage of Sudak development started at that time. Vineyards and fruit gardens were planted and new buildings were constructed. From late XIX century on Sudak is known as a Black Sea resort.

The Civil War and World War II didn't skirt Sudak. Each time the town was rebuilt and kept living...

The main street in Sudak, the Lenin Street, goes past the "Sudak" Tourist and Health Center. Right after the Center the Sugar Head rock overlooks the road. Right behind the rock the impressive ruins of the Sudak fortress can be seen. The Fortress is one of the major and impressive historical sites of the Crimean Peninsula. Its two-tier defense constructions still look inaccessible. The constructions of various times (walls, towers, temples, and casemates) keep the memory on various peoples, Greeks, Armenians, Khazars, Turks, Italians, and Russians...

The oldest memorial of the Russian period in Sudak is the church of the early XIX century. The first local hospital building and Tatar neighborhood of the old town have survived all cataclysms as well. Low houses with tile roofs go up the hill.

Modern Sudak is a center of viticulture and winemaking. Seven big vineyards produce about 20,000 tons of high-grade grapes annually for the original dessert wines. The ether-oil species, such as rose, lavender and sage are planted in the Valley. The product of Production local ether-oil factory is partially exported to foreign companies.

BAKHCHISARAI

Bakhchisaray is a Crimean town and regional center. Its history dates back into the late 15-th, when the Crimean dynasty of the Crimean Khans Girays reigned. Initially, Khan's residence was situated on the plateau of Chufut-Kale but later, due to political reasons, it moved to the mountain bottom, into the valley of the Churuk-Su ("stale water") River where Bakhchisaray was found. In the Turkic language "Bakhchisaray" means "a palace in the gardens". Under the reign of Khan Mengly-Girey, the town became the capital of the Crimean Khanate and played its role till 1783. The main tourist attractions of Bakhchisaray are the Khan's Palace built in the early 16-th century by Khan Abdul-Sakhal Girey, and the famous "Fountain of Tears" built by Iranian master Omer by will of Khan Qirim-Girey to memorize his beloved wife Dilara-Bikech who had died in 1764. The Fountain was praised by Alexander Pushkin in his poem "The Fountain of Bakhchisaray". Today the Palace is a historical and architectural museum.



Chufut-Kale ("The Jewish (or Karaim) Fortress"), Orthodox Assumption cave monastery – a record of the Russian presence in the medieval Crimea, Tatar town and the Palace make Bakhchisaray at the same time a Jewish, Christian Orthodox, and Muslim town.

Nowhere in the Crimea but in ancient and modern Bakhchisaray and its surroundings you will feel the flavor of the Medieval Age walking along its narrow winding streets and modern multi-storey buildings. Its rich history and monuments attract many thousands of tourists.

KOKTEBEL

Koktebel... This word is of Turkic origin (Kok-Topē-El stands for the Land of Blue Peaks). The best known of them is Karadag (Black Mountain), the oldest volcano in our country and a single (on the CIS European territory) volcano of Jurassic period, which preserved the lineaments of its origin.

Valleys around Karadag were inhabited from long time ago. In the early I century BC the legendary Cimmerians, the most ancient Crimean peoples, lived here. In medieval times Koktebel was inhabited by local breeds, the descendants of Taures and Skythians assimilated with the nationalities from Bosporus – Greeks, Sarmats and Alans. In X century



the colony was destroyed by the Pechenegs. The life there recovered only 2-3 centuries afterwards. A Tatar village was founded in the place of present Koktebel. In early XIX century the colonists from Bulgaria settled here. Almost up to the end of XIX century Koktebel was a tiny colony linked with Feodosiya by bad dirt road.

Professor-oculist Z. A. Yunge was the founder of local resort. He purchased the land in Koktebel valley with intention to transform it into a prosperous resort, but his money was insufficient. This forced him to sell the land by small lots. This is the way the first country-houses (dachas) appeared here in early XX century. Poet and artist M. Voloshin built his house here in 1903. Gradually the house became some kind of vacation house. A lot of outstanding people, such as M. Gorky, A. Tolstoy, V. Brusov, V. Veresaev, M. Tsvetaeva, O. Mandelshtam, K. Trenev, M. Bulgakov and many others visited it at different times.

M. Voloshin donated his house to the Writers Union. Later the Koktebel House of Creative Work was formed there. The poet's home is the museum of literature and arts at present.

M. Voloshin died August 11, 1932. According to the poet's last will, he was buried on the peak of Kuchuk-Enishar mountain ridge.

Koktebel is deservedly called the motherland of domestic gliding. Here the future academician, the chief constructor of space vehicles S. P. Korolev raised his gliders Krasnaya Zvezda (Red Star) and Koktebel for the first time. Famous airplane constructors S. V. Ilyshin, O. K. Antonov and A. S. Yakovlev started their way to big aviation from gliding here. The museum of gliding was opened on the premises of Priboy (Surf) Resort Center.

THE SETTLEMENT OF SOVIETSKIY

The first mention of the library in the settlement of Ichki (such was the name of the settlement of Sovietsky until 1944) dates back to the rampant years of the Civil War. As stated in the encyclopedia, the library was opened in Ichki in 1921 for the purpose of extirpation of illiteracy and, in combination with the club under which it operated, contributed to the acculturation of the local community.

When the settlement was seized during the Great Patriotic War (1941-1945), almost all of the library's book collection was destroyed, and the library celebrated its rebirth only after the victory.

In the years that passed, the library moved from one building to another, and only in 1982 it moved to its current specially designated premises.



In 1978, the public libraries of the Sovietsky Region were assembled in a network which was headed by the Sovietskaya Central Regional Library. The Sovietskaya Central Library System includes two regional libraries, i.e., the above Sovietskaya Central Regional Library named after Chub and the Sovietskaya Central Regional Library for the Children, and 23 rural branch libraries. In 2005, the Sovietskaya Central Regional Library was named after Mikhail Ilyich Chub, commander of the Ichki partisan party during the Great Patriotic War. It was this partisan party which triggered the partisan war in the Crimea by its first fighting on November 3, 1941. The idea to name the leading library of the library system after the legendary partisan commander can be explained by the fact that the patriotic work with the library's users and readers is a priority task of the central library system in general.

The settlement of Sovietsky is the center of the Sovietsky Region. Today, the territory of the settlement and its suburbs were inhabited in the 13th-10th centuries BC, which is confirmed by the remains of the settlements of the early and late Bronze Age and Scythian burial grounds. The first mention of Ichki dates back to 1798. In 1892, after the completion of Dzhankoy-Feodosiya railway road, the station of Ichki was built. It was used by the major corn-factors to export corn. In January 1921, the settlement became the center of the Ichki Region of the Feodosiya province.

Today, 9,866 people live in the settlement of Sovietsky. The settlement has three secondary modern schools of the 1st-3rd grades, a music school, an agrarian college, a historical and local history museum, a central regional library, a house of culture, a regional hospital, several drugstores, food stores, a market and points of sale. The settlement has a railway station and a bus station from which one can easily reach any point of destination. In 2008, the settlement was connected to the central gas supply system.

SIMFEROPOL

Simpheropolis means “a city of benefit and a gatherer” and its coat of arms carries a hive with honeybees and an inscription “Poleznoye” (literally, “Beneficial”). Simferopol is located in the center of the Crimean Peninsula and accumulates everything the peninsula is famous for. The city is administrative, economic, and cultural center of the Crimean Autonomous Republic.

The city’s locality has a long and rich history. From the 3d century BC to the 4th century AD, Neapolis, the capital of the Scythian state, was located on the plateau south from the today’s city center. This was a vital place in the times of the Crimean khanate and, for some time, the residence of Kalgi Sultan, the second person in the khanate.

Today, Simferopol cannot boast of architectural sites but some buildings are worthy of attention: Kebir-Jami Mosque, the city’s oldest building of 1508; Vorontsov’s House in the park Salgirka; the former male regional gymnasium; the former hospice; Franko Republican Universal Scientific Library which was built in 1826 for the Gentility Assembly and gave its premises during the Crimean War to the hospital where the famous surgeon N. I. Pirogov worked; the nearby Gorky Russian Drama Theater which was erected in 1911 after the plans of an eminent architect A. N. Beketov.



FEODOSIA

Feodosia is one of the oldest towns in Europe. It is over 2,500 years old. The Hellenes settled here long Before Christ. They founded the town and called it Feodosia (God-given). Ancient Feodosia was famous for its harbor and seaport as well as rich fields.

Later the town was allotted into the Bosphorus State. In the IV century BC it was destroyed by the Huns. In medieval times the town was known as Kaffa. The Genoese ruled the town for two centuries and made it the administrative and trade center of their Crimean provinces. Fortifications defending from Tatar were built around the town. Their remains survived up to date. In the XV century Kaffa was conquered by the Ottoman Turks and became the center the Turkish Sultan Crimean province and the main slave market.



During the Russian-Turkish War the town was taken by Russians. The initial name Feodosia was returned to the town. During the World War II the front line passed through Feodosia four times.

The town has lost its ancient image. It was destroyed too much times in its ancient and modern history, but medieval street planning survived in one of the neighborhoods.

Many places in Feodosia are associated with famous individuals. The great artist I. Aivazovsky was born and spent the great deal of his life here. Poet M. Voloshin and writer A. Grin lived in Feodosia as well.
